Market Access



Air

One of the greatest logistical advantages for Brampton businesses is its proximity to Toronto Pearson, Canada's largest international airport, just minutes away. Canada's busiest airport is the hub for over 49 million passengers annually with flights to 210 destinations and handling over 312,000 tons of air cargo a year.



Sea

Situated between two of the largest ports on Lake Ontario (Port of Toronto and Port of Hamilton) Brampton has direct access to the most important domestic and international transportation systems, as well as the Atlantic Ocean via the St. Lawrence Seaway. This waterway to the world provides key transportation, distribution, storage and container services.



Land

Brampton is at the centre of Canada's major transportation corridors and provides proximity and access to the U.S. border. Being within a day's drive of 158 million US consumers makes Brampton the ideal place to locate North American operations.



Rail

Brampton is home to CN – Canada's largest Intermodal Terminal, servicing over 2,000 trucks daily from its 195-acre multimodal facility located in the Greater Toronto Hamilton Area supply chain corridor. Both the CN Intermodal Terminal and the CP terminal (located on the Brampton's border) provide direct access to the Asia-Pacific Gateway through quick and efficient import of container goods coming via rail from Vancouver and Prince-Rupert maritime ports. They also connect to the US through Detroit and Europe via the Montreal port.
