

Brampton Highlights

Brampton is the 9th largest city in Canada; 4th largest in Ontario and 3rd largest within the Greater Toronto Area.

The 2016 Census counted a total population of 593,638 in Brampton, an increase of 13.3 per cent or 69,727 persons from the 2011 Census (see Table 1). This compares to the provincial average of 4.6 per cent and the national average of 5.0per cent .

Brampton had the 2nd highest growth rate among Canada's 25 largest cities. At 69,727 Brampton had the 4th largest net increase in population among Canada's largest cities.

Brampton's population density was about 2,229 persons per square kilometre in 2016, up 13.3 per cent from 1967.1 reported in the 2011 Census (see Table 2).

Brampton ranked 6th nationally behind Vancouver, Montréal, Toronto, Burnaby and Mississauga in terms of population density.

There were a total of 173,4287 private dwellings in 2016, up 12.1 per cent or 18,765 dwellings from the 2011 Census (see Table 3).



Figure 2: Top Five Municipalities in GTA Ranking based on 2016 Census Population





Figure 3: Brampton 30 Year Population Growth

Brampton Continues Strong Growth

Brampton had the 2nd highest growth rate among Canada's 25 largest cities.

From 1986 to 2016 Brampton's population has increased 3.15 times or on average 7.16 per cent per year.
