
### **Bulletin Highlights:**

Brampton's 2016 average Age: 36.5 (lowest average age of Canada's largest cities).
Brampton's gender split was 49.4% male and 50.6% female.

•27.5% of Brampton's population was 19 years and younger and 11.2% of the population was 65 years and older.

# **Brampton Highlights**

#### **Brampton Highlights**

In 2016 Brampton had a total population of 593,638, an increase of 13.3% from the 2011 Census. Brampton ranked 2nd in population growth between 2011 and 2016 when compared to other municipalities greater than 200,000. At 36.5, Brampton had the lowest average age among Canada's largest cities.

#### Average Age

Brampton was one of the youngest communities in the Toronto Census Metropolitan Area (Toronto CMA) according to the 2016 Census data released by Statistics Canada on May 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2017.

The average age of Brampton's population was 36.5 in 2016.

Toronto CMA's average age was 39.7 years, younger than the provincial average age of 41.0 and the national median age of 41.0.

In 2016, 120,240 children aged 0 to 14 and 66,270 persons aged 65 and over were enumerated in Brampton, representing respectively 20.3% and 11.2% of the total population. The working age population (15 to 64) represented 68.6% of the total population.

In comparison, for Canada the proportions of children, of seniors and in age of working were 16.6%, 16.9% and 66.5% in 2016.

#### **Age Distribution**

In 2016, the **pre-school** population aged 4 and under accounted for 6.3% of Brampton's total population.


Representing 49.2% of Peel Region's pre-school population.

#### Sex

The 2011 Census counted 293,535 (49.4%) males and 300,105 (50.6%) females in Brampton.


#### Figure 1: City of Brampton - Age and Sex Distribution

#### Figure 2: Brampton Age Distribution by Sex, 2011-2016



Seniors (aged 65 and over) as a percentage of the total city population increased from 9.1% in 2011 to 11.2% in 2016.

As a percent of the total population, pre-teen children (aged 0-9) decreased from 14.1% in 2011 to 13.3% in 2016.

#### Figure 3: The Regional Municipality of Peel

In 2016, Brampton accounted for 43.0 % of the Peel Region population, an increase from 40.4% in 2011. Of Peel's population, Brampton represents 46.5% of residents aged 19 and under, 42.6% between 20 and 64 and 37.5% 65 and over.



#### Figure 5: City of Brampton – Dwelling Characteristics




Between 2011 and 2016, the number of private households in Brampton increased by 78,975 units to a total of 168,010 up 12.6%.

The average number of persons in private households was 3.5, up from 3.4 in 2006.

According to the 2016 Census, 52.1% of the private dwelling inventory were single-detached, 21.9 % apartments, 13.7% semi-detached and 12.3% were row houses.
