
# Education, Labour and Journey to Work November 30, 2022

### **Bulletin Highlights:**

- Brampton's labour force grew from 319,620 in 2016 to 355,755 in 2021. 308,360 people were employed.
- 15.3 percent of all total employed workers were self-employed in 2021.
- 22% of the workforce worked from home.
- The Transportation and Warehousing industry accounted for the largest segment of Brampton employed labour force with 54,860 workers.
- At 10.3 percent, public transit use was the second most popular mode of transportation to work in 2021.
- For people that commute to a usual place of work, only 77,185 work in Brampton. 111,865 people leave the City of Brampton to work.
- 30.3 percent of Brampton's population aged 15 and overheld Bachelor's degree or higher. This includes Bachelor's degree, University certificate or diploma above bachelor level, Degree in medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine or optometry, Master's degree and Doctorate.



#### Labour Force by Industry in Brampton(2021)



Industry categories are based on the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). The largest industry in Brampton is Transportation and Warehousing followed by Manufacturing and Retail Trade. In 2016, Manufacturing Industry was the largest industry based on employment.







#### **Labour Force by Occupation**




Occupation categories are based on the National Occupational Classification (NOC) 2021. Occupation is defined by Statistics Canada as the kind of work performed by persons aged 15 years and over. For Brampton's labour force, the largest occupation is Trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations, followed closely by Sales and service occupations and the third largest is Business, finance and administration occupations.




The 2021 Census counted 290,480 employees in Brampton's Labour force, a 4.8% increase from 2016. Self-employed is use to refer to persons aged 15 years and over with or without an incorporated business and with or without paid help according to Statistics Canada. In 2021, total Self-employed workers are 52,435, a 57.7% increase from 2016 census.



#### **City of Brampton - Labour Force Activity**









#### City of Brampton - Labour Force and Transportation


Main mode of commuting in 2021





37% of the employed labour force spend between 15-29 minutes commuting to work. 11% spend over an hour .










# Population Distribution aged 15 and over by Highest Certificate, Degree or Diploma

#### **Glossary**

**Labour force status:** Refers to whether a person aged 15 years and over was employed, unemployed or not in the labour force during the week of Sunday, May 2 to Saturday, May 8, 2021. For information on the comparability of the 2021 Census labour force status data with those of the Labour Force Survey, see <u>Appendix 2.11 of the Dictionary, Census of Population</u>, 2021.

**Class of worker** including job permanency refers to whether a person is a paid employee or is self-employed. Employees' positions are further classified as either permanent or temporary.

**Labour Force by Occupation:** Refers to the kind of work performed by persons aged 15 years and over as determined by their kind of work and the description of the main activities in their job. The occupation data are produced according to the National Occupational Classification [NOC] 2021 Version 1.0.

**Labour force by industry:** Refers to the general nature of the business carried out in the establishment where the person worked. The industry data are produced according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Canada 2017 Version 3.0.

Main mode of transportation: refers to the main mode of transportation a person uses to travel to their place of work. The census assumes that the commute to work originates from the usual place of residence, but this may not always be the case. Sometimes, respondents may be on a business trip and may have reported their place of work or main mode of commuting based on where they were working during the trip. Some persons maintain a residence close to work and commute to their home on weekends. Students often work after school at a location near their school. As a result, the data may show unusual commutes or unusual main modes of commuting.

**Commuting duration:** refers to the length of time, in minutes, usually required by a person to travel to their place of work.

Major field of study This variable shows the 'Variant of CIP 2021 - Alternative primary groupings,' with the hierarchy of the primary groupings and two-digit series. When a primary grouping contains more than one subseries from series '30. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary studies,' these subseries are grouped together. An exception is made for '30.01 Biological and physical sciences' due to its large size. For more information on the CIP classification, see the Classification of Instructional Programs, Canada, 2021

**Level of attainment (Highest certificate, diploma or degree)** refers to the highest level of education that a person has successfully completed and is derived from the educational qualifications questions, which asked for all certificates, diplomas and degrees to be reported.
