
Bulletin Highlights:

- Brampton's 2021 average Age: 37.5 (lowest average age of Canada's largest cities).
- Brampton's gender split was 49.99% male and 50.01% female.
- 24.46% of Brampton's population was 19 years and younger and 12.46% of the population was 65 years and older.
- Working population(15-64 years) is 69.6% of total population.

Figure 1: Median Age Over Time




AVERAGE VALUE OF DWELLINGS OCCUPIED PRIVATE DWELLINGS

Brampton Highlights

In 2021 Brampton had a total population of 656,480, an increase of 10.6% from the 2016. Brampton ranked 1st in population growth between 2016 and 2021 among the 25 largest municipalities.

Average Age

Brampton was one of the youngest communities in the Toronto Census Metropolitan Area (Toronto CMA) and the lowest average age amongst Canada's largest cities at the age of 37.5.

Toronto CMA's average age was 40.7 years, younger than the provincial average age of 41.8 and the national median age of 41.6.

Age Distribution

In 2021, the **pre-school** population aged 4 and under accounted for 5.45% of Brampton's total population.

Representing 50.3% of Peel Region's pre-school population.

Figure 3: City of Brampton - Age Distribution




Figure 4: Canada - Age Distribution









Figure 5: Brampton Age Distribution by Sex, 2016-2021



Seniors (aged 65 and over) as a percentage of the total city population increased from 11.2% in 2016 to 12.5% in 2021.

As a percent of the total population, pre-teen children (aged 0-9) decreased from 13.3% in 2016 to 11.48% in 2021.

In 2021, Brampton accounted for 45.2 % of the Peel Region population, an increase from 43.0% in 2016. Of Peel's population, Brampton represents 48.2% of residents aged 19 and under, 45.7% between 20 and 64 and 38.5% 65 and over.








Figure 6: City of Brampton – Total Number Private Households by Household Size



Between 2016 and 2021, the number of private households in Brampton increased by 14,465 units to a total of 182,475 up 8.61%.

The average number of persons in private households was 3.6, up from 3.5 in 2016.





Movable dwelling includes mobile homes and other movable dwellings such as houseboats, recreational vehicles and railroad cars.

Private dwelling refers to a separate set of living quarters with a private entrance either from outside the building or from a common hall, lobby, vestibule or stairway inside the building. The entrance to the dwelling must be one that can be used without passing through the living quarters of some other person or group of persons.

Period of construction refers to the period in time during which the building or dwelling was originally constructed. This refers to the period in which the building was completed, not the time of any later remodeling, additions or conversions.

For properties having multiple residential structures, this refers to the period in which the most recent structure was completed.
