2023 ECONOMIC OVERVIEW

WHY BRAMPTON

The City of Brampton Economic Development Office is focused on fostering economic growth, attracting investment, and supporting local businesses. It serves as a centralized resource hub, offering a range of services and initiatives to both existing businesses and those looking to establish a presence in Brampton.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Axium Packaging Inc. is investing over **\$80 million** for a new plastics manufacturing facility that will create **250 new jobs**.
- Lululemon, a popular athleisure clothing company, announced that it is building its largest distribution facility in North America, right here in Brampton. The facility will **bring 1,500 jobs to Brampton**.
- Alectra opened a new 400-employee LEED Certified Operations Centre.
- Magna International is expanding its presence in Brampton, building a new facility that will manufacture battery trays for electric vehicles. This facility will create **560 new advanced manufacturing jobs** in Brampton.



NEW INVESTMENT

MAGNA INTERNATIONAL EXPANDS WITH ADVANCED MANUFACTURING INVESTMENT CREATING 560 NEWS JOBS

MAGNA

The City of Brampton continues to establish itself as a global leader in innovation, with Magna International expanding its already impressive footprint within the city. The company will be opening a 490,000 sq. ft. facility at 100 Ace Dr., a new, state-of-the art build by Panattoni Developments. This investment by Magna, the largest of six investments announced in 2023 by the company, will create 560 new advanced manufacturing jobs in Brampton.

Magna International will be manufacturing battery enclosures for the Electric Vehicle Sector (EV) at the site, bolstering the city's world-class advanced manufacturing sector. This builds on the City of Brampton's ongoing support of our well-established automotive and parts manufacturing sector, including the Stellantis assembly plant, which will begin retooling and modernizing toward the company's EV future at the end of 2024. Business Facilities Magazine has also awarded Panattoni Development Company Inc. and Magna International with their 2023 Deal of The Year Impact Award for the investment category in Canada. This investment further cements the company's strong commitment to growth in the region, adding to the already impressive footprint of seven existing facilities, employing more than 2,000 people in Brampton.

The City's Economic Development team has worked diligently on this expansion project from its inception, promoting it with site selectors and investors on a national and international scale. It's been just over a year since the announcement, and staff have actively offered a concierge service ensuring open lines of communication. Additionally, staff facilitated critical conversations with Alectra and the Region of Peel.



Magna's roots in Ontario run deep, and we are excited about opening a new facility dedicated to a strategic electrification product. The Brampton facility, coupled with investment and growth in five existing Ontario facilities, allows Magna to keep up with customer demands across several product areas. We are excited to bring new business, more investment and additional jobs to Ontario.

ALECTRA OPENS NEW 400-EMPLOYEE LEED CERTIFIED OPERATIONS CENTRE

Alectra Utilities has expanded in Brampton at their brand-new operations centre located at 200 Kennedy Road South.

Within one kilometre of the new location are 78 businesses in the retail sector and 55 in accommodation and food services. In bringing 400 employees to the area – two and a half times the number of jobs at the current site – Alectra will help strengthen Brampton's retail and food businesses in near distance of the operations centre, supporting growth in the area. In line with the City's commitment to sustainability, the new facility will be LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certified to Gold Standard and function as the consolidated operations centre for more than 400 Alectra employees serving Brampton and Mississauga.



Some of the LEED certified building features will include:

- upgraded dedicated outdoor air systems (DOAS) – reducing GHG emissions by approximately 43% beyond LEED Gold standards
- 500KW in rooftop solar power generation over 800 MWh/year of renewable energy will help meet building power requirements
- over 30 electric vehicle charging stations to be installed and used by Alectra fleet vehicles, employees, and the general public

Alectra is also investing \$30 million over the next five years to replace and upgrade underground cables in Brampton.

LULULEMON CHOOSES BRAMPTON FOR LARGEST DISTRIBUTION CENTRE IN NORTH AMERICA

Lululemon, a renowned athletic apparel company, announced a one million square ft. office and distribution centre in Brampton at 5515 Countryside Drive. It will be the athletic apparel company's largest in both Canada and the U.S. and will bring 1,500 jobs to Brampton.

The decision to locate their distribution centre here is a testament to Brampton's strategic location and growing reputation as a hub for businesses. Lululemon's presence will not only contribute to our local job market but also enhance our city's economic landscape.

Based out of Vancouver, Lululemon was established in 1998 and has more than 650 locations worldwide.

PROLOGIS



PET-VALU OPENS LARGEST DISTRIBUTION CENTRE IN CANADA

Pet Valu, a leading specialty retailer of pet food and pet-related supplies in Canada, has invested in Brampton by opening their largest pet specialty distribution centre in Canada. Pet Valu opens a new 670,000 Square foot, state of the art facility as the centre piece of its supply chain transformation.

Representing a key milestone in the Company's nationwide \$110 million supply chain transformation; the distribution centre will bring unprecedented scale and automation to Canada's pet sector as the largest distribution centre and robotics automation installation dedicated to serving the pet specialty industry.

We selected Brampton as the location for our Greater Toronto Area distribution centre due to the outstanding labour availability, geographic proximity to the centre of gravity of our store network and favourable lead times to activate the site quickly. Like Pet Valu, Brampton is growing and transforming and the city's vibrant, entrepreneurial approach is an ideal fit for our needs.



NEW INVESTMENT

AXIUM PACKAGING INC. EXPANDS



Axium is expanding its operations and construction is underway with a new manufacturing facility in Brampton. They are investing over \$80M and employing 250 team members at this location.

The new site is anticipated to open in July 2024. Axium has 20 manufacturing plants in the United States, Canada and Mexico and employs over 3,600 employees. Axium provides design engineering and tool building solutions for its customers' packaging needs including: plastic containers, tubes, caps and high end decorating services.

In line with the City's climate goals and priority of creating greener cities, Axium is focused on sustainability and engineering facilities for the future. From designing packaging with optimized bottle weights to building manufacturing facilities to be LEED Silver compliant, the Axium team prioritizes sustainability initiatives in all aspects of its business.

The investment Axium is making in Brampton further solidifies the company's commitment to growth in Ontario.

Through proactive engagement and streamlined processes, the City facilitated expedited building permits for Axium's project. Additionally, the Economic Development team played a pivotal role in connecting Axium with relevant organizations such as the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA), ensuring smooth coordination and compliance with regulatory requirements. This collaborative approach exemplifies Brampton's dedication to fostering investment and supporting business growth.

LOCAL INVESTMENT CARDINAL MEATS

Cardinal Meats, Canada's largest producer of burgers, invested \$10 million to expand its operations in Brampton in 2023. This expansion has introduced new product lines to the plant, including the new boneless rib steak, stuffed burger line and the new Fresty retail line.

Cardinal Meats' reputation for delivering quality products precedes it, with its burgers gracing the menus of renowned brands such as Tim Hortons, Harvey's, and Sobeys.

METELIX INVESTS \$20 MILLION INTO ITS BRAMPTON FACILITY

Metelix Products Inc., established in 2009, is a fullservice blow molding manufacturer with two global blow molding plants combined with a machining and tooling fabrication facility. Both facilities are IAFT registered that service automotive OEM and Tier 1 partners. A growing facet of Metelix is industrial and commercial product offerings to customers including: Volkswagon, General Motors, Toyota, and Ford. The expansion of Metelix was initiated to enable the company to produce three new automotive programs.

Soilers - \$5M per year for the next 5 years (total contract \$25M), running boards \$12M per year for 9 years (total contract \$108M), air ducts \$1M per year for 7 years (total contract \$7M)

(Pre-addition the facility was at approx. \$35M sales.)

The expansion added 55,000 sq,ft of space to the original building at 95 Van Kirk, Brampton. Employment grew from 65 full-time to 105 full-time; including 40 new full-time manufacturing jobs.



LOCAL INVESTMENT



ALBEA BRAMPTON HAS INVESTED \$9 MILLION INTO ITS BRAMPTON FACILITY

Albea invested \$9 million to introduce a state-of-the-art plastic extrusion line. This strategic investment aims to transition the company's product line to "green leaf" packaging, a move that will render the packaging fully recyclable.

The installation of the new plastic extrusion line not only underscores Albea's commitment to environmental responsibility but also positions the company as a key player in the eco-friendly packaging industry. The "green leaf" packaging initiative aligns with global efforts to reduce environmental impact and promote sustainable practices.

One of the significant outcomes of this investment is the introduction of a distinct "Made in Brampton" label for the products manufactured through this new process. This label not only signifies the local origin of the products but also serves as a testament to Albea Brampton's dedication to supporting the local economy.

The implementation of the plastic extrusion line is expected to create new employment opportunities in the Brampton area. Albea anticipates adding new jobs, contributing to the local community's economic growth, and providing skilled employment opportunities for residents.

The impact of this investment extends beyond Brampton, as the newly produced "Made in Brampton" products are slated for North America, Australia, and China.



BRAMPTON ANGELS

Brampton Angels launched in March 2023, and is a members-only not-for-profit organization of accredited investors. Brampton Angels members provide dynamic early-stage companies with valuable mentorship and access to risk capital networks to initiate learning, networking and growth.

A typical angel investment is anywhere between \$25,000 - \$100,000 in a company. Since its launch, they have hosted a total of 5 meetings and heard 15 startups pitch.

Summer Company

Each year BEC continues to support young entrepreneurs in their journey to success through the Ontario Summer Company Program. In the summer of 2023, ten students, aged15-29 years, were given the opportunity to use the program grant of \$3,000 to launch their own businesses,

creating 12 new jobs in Brampton. Students were supported through business training, mentorship and coaching to support their business development.

STARTER COMPANY+

In 2023, BEC supported Brampton entrepreneurs in starting, growing, and expanding their businesses through Starter Company Plus. The program provided small business owners, 18 years of age and older, with training, mentoring and a micro-grant of up to \$5,000

for eligible participants. In the past year, BEC provided 25 grants (\$125,000 in total funding) through this program to various types of businesses including e-commerce, retail, and the creative industries.

YOUTH ENTREPRENEUR FEATURE

Founded in 2023 by Chloe Goodridge with support from the Summer Company program, The Black Youth Creative (B.Y.C.) emerged in response to a community need for programs specifically designed for Black Youth. With a mission to bridge this gap, B.Y.C. provides tailored programs aimed at guiding Black Youth through the exploration of visual art fundamentals, empowering them to discover and amplify their creative voices.

CITY LAUNCHES FIRST-EVER MEDTECH TASK FORCE TO FOSTER INVESTMENT, RESEARCH AND INNOVATION

With new and established life sciences companies calling Brampton home, and the recent announcement of Toronto Metropolitan University's new medical school. Brampton's health and life sciences sector is on the cusp of an exciting phase of growth.

The City launched the MedTech Task Force with the goal to advance medical innovation in Brampton, including Council's priority for establishing postsecondary medical education and institutional uses benefitting Brampton residents and businesses.

HOME TO Industry giants

This Task Force will help:

- find new ways to attract investment to support science, research and commercialization, and
- foster the development of Brampton's health technology ecosystem, and
- support the development of highly skilled jobs and training opportunities for the medical industry.

Comprised of representatives of the business, academic and development communities – and supported by City staff – the Task Force will make recommendations to Council on the future direction of the MedTech sector and the exciting work on the new medical school.

The inaugural meeting of the Task Force was held on May 24, 2023 with representatives from several industry leaders including Medtronic, Boston Scientific, Taro Pharmaceuticals, The Stevens Company and Dynacare.
